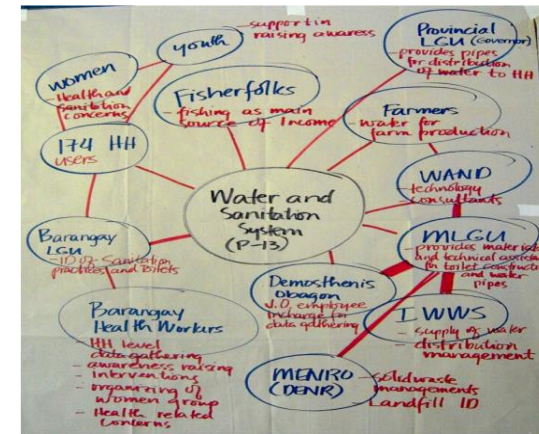

Status Assessment Report: Finding KEY ISSUES

The Status Assessment defines the key issues for improving sanitation in the city based on analyzing all collected data.

- It provides an analysis of the collected data, which should provided the basis for evidence-based decisions
→ Higher acceptance.
- It includes the assessment of the requirement for the future
- It prioritizes the areas for further actions

Good examples from Status Assessment Reports

Nandyal

- Further strengthening from good starting report
- All required data provided

Amalapuram

- Water supply sector is covered in detail
- City wide key-issues have been identified
- Overall report is well structured

Bhimavaram

- Very well structured
- Sub-city level data well presented in tabular format
- Key Issues well identified



Good examples from Status Reports

Nellore

- All data required are provided
- Action Plan well developed

Eluru

- Very detailed explanation of the Solid Waste Management Process
- Rich data provided, especially on Water Supply

Kadiri

- Provision of detailed maps on Solid Waste Management
- Well structure, genuine effort without any copy and paste of information



Areas for strengthening

1. Base maps
2. Details of the proceedings with the CSTF (Minutes of Meetings, Photographs, etc.)
3. Analysis of provided data for current situation and future projections
4. Formulation of Key Issues and Vision
5. It is necessary to include on-going and planned project (DPR)
6. Don't copy and paste



Key issues of Chittur-Thathamangalam

1. The Prevalence of open defecation in limited spots of the Municipality
2. Mixing of bio-degradable waste with non-bio degradable and hazardous waste
3. Intermittent supply of potable water
4. Unscientific treatment of septage
5. Insufficient coverage of drainage system
6. Contamination of receiving water bodies and improper maintenance of private ponds
7. Lack of planned capacity building strategy
8. Absence of required Municipal bye-law and poor enforcement of existing regulation
9. Overlapping/diffused/unclear roles and responsibilities
